
- CABI along with IFPRI developed, implemented and evaluated an innovative advisory service that complements "picture-based insurance" (PBI), providing easy-tounderstand low-cost insurance coverage for visible crop damage during Rabi 2017-2018 season in Haryana, India
- CABI associated with Vodafone's KisanMitr Service as a major partner, offering mobile-ready digital content covering all the knowledge domains for major crops (rice, maize and sugarcane) for a three month pilot. There were ~16,286 previews of videos in three months from 10 states of India
- CABI, in association with Department of Agriculture, Sri Lanka, has partnered with Dialog Axiata and currently disseminating crop advisory on 15 plus crops in regional language through mAgri service named GoviMithuru. The service presently has over 300,000 users




Focus on agriculture production – future threats


