DISTRIBUTION MAPS OF PESTS

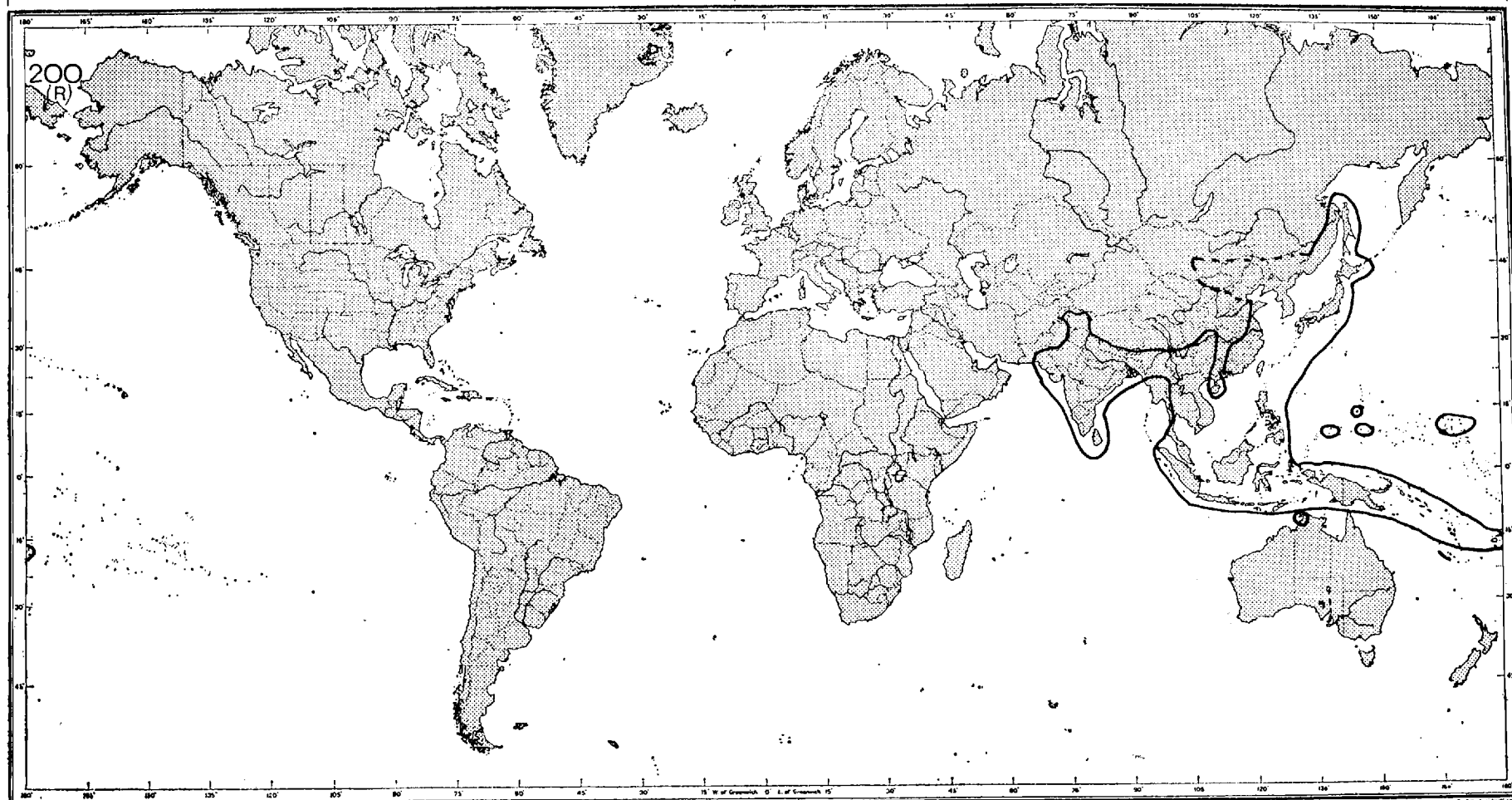
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Pest: *Sogatella furcifera* (Horv.)

- N.B.—India. The revision of this species-complex by Fennah (51 379) p. 50 refers to the need for more Indian material. No records have been seen for Rajasthan. Indo-China. Hanson's records (54 462) for Kampuchea and Grist & Lever (*loc. cit.*) for Laos have been extended so that the whole of the former Indo-China has been included. USSR. It has been assumed that the Ussuri region is the part of Siberia where this delphacid occurs. Africa, America and West Indies. The distribution given by Socho Nasu (*loc. cit.*) is erroneous and is probably due to confusion with *Sogatodes oryzicola* (Muir)—Map No. 202 or/and *S. cubanus* (Crawf.)—Map No. 224.
