Introduction

- There are many international frameworks etc that encompass efforts encouraging a move towards pesticide risk reduction however, local context is key
- We recognize that the barriers faced, and progress made around pesticide risk reduction vary substantially between countries
- It is therefore vital that we understand the particular demands and needs of specific countries and regions
- This sessions aims to identify the needs and demands of different countries in relation to pesticide risk reduction

Member Country Pesticide Risk Reduction documents

Overview of materials received

- In 100% of the documents, we can see that there are existing overarching policies in place for the management and use of pesticides e.g. pesticide acts
- Most countries reviewed have already legislation in place or in development relating to the registration of biologicals
- 70% of the countries providing materials showing evidence that IPM or other lower risk approaches to farming are advocated for at policy level
- Highlighted gaps and requirements included quality assurance of bioprotection products, improved knowledge, private sector involvement, etc
- There is evidence of government level support for research and development in some countries
