Biographies



Dr Ambrose AgonaDirector General, National Agricultural Research Organization (NARO)

Dr Agona is an agricultural research scientist, leader and practitioner and has been honoured as one of the Visionaries of Uganda, in recognition of his contribution to the socio-economic transformation of Uganda. He has held numerous positions, including Head of the National Post-Harvest Research Programme at NARO, Director of Research at the National Agricultural Research Laboratories (Kawanda), Chairman of the Association for Strengthening Agricultural Research in Eastern and Central Africa ASARECA Board of Directors, and Chairman of the Africa Rice National Experts Committee. Since 2009, he has been Vice President of the Association of Ugandan Professional Agriculturalists. Dr Agona has a PhD in Agriculture from the University of Zimbabwe.



Dr Lutz-Peter Berg
CABI Executive Council Chair

Lutz-Peter Berg is the Swiss Science and Technology Attaché for the UK, Ireland and the Nordic countries, based at the Swiss Embassy in London. His role includes observing and reporting on UK, Irish and Nordic policies in Science, Innovation and Higher Education as well as facilitating contacts, collaborations and communications between Swiss scientists, government agencies and high-tech businesses and potential international partners. Lutz's background is in biomedical research and development. He holds a PhD in Molecular Genetics from the University of London and a Master's degree in Biology from the University in Goettingen, Germany.



Christian Borgemeister

Director of the Center for Development Research (ZEF); Professor of Ecology and Natural Resources Management, University of Bonn

Christian Borgemeister has served as Managing Director of ZEF since 2014. Prior to that, he was the Director General of the International Centre of Insect Physiology. A trained entomologist, he is Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture. He was the recipient of the 2011 International Plant Protection Award of Distinction of the International Association for the Plant Protection Sciences, and won the 2015 Distinguished Scientist Award of Entomological Society of America's International Branch. Christian has authored/co-authored more than 200 papers in peer-reviewed scientific journals.



Professor Paul Bosu

Director-General of Ghana's Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR)

Professor Paul Bosu is the Director-General of Ghana's Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR). He co-chairs the national Research-Extension-Farmer Linkage Committees (RELCs) and has been actively involved in the Modernizing Agriculture in Ghana (MAG) programme since 2019. Paul has Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Biological Sciences, from the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST) Ghana, and a PhD in Forest Entomology from Northern Arizona University, USA. His research has covered studies of natural enemies of tree pests, mechanisms of plant resistance to insect pests, and integrated pest management strategies in agroforestry and mixed-species plantations. He has also participated in studies and projects involving forest invasive species and insect pollinators.
